What is Soroptimist?

Soroptimist is a global women's organization whose members work to improve the lives of women and girls through programs leading to social and economic empowerment. Soroptimist programs focus on providing women and girls with access to education, which is one of the most effective ways to end social problems disproportionately affecting women and girls.

What does the word "Soroptimist" mean?

Loosely translated from Latin, Soroptimist is a coined term meaning "best for women."

When was Soroptimist formed?

The first Soroptimist club was formed in 1921 by a group of 80 women in Oakland, Alameda County, California, USA.

Why does Soroptimist focus on women and girls?

Soroptimist was formed because in 1921 women who were interested in volunteering in their communities were not permitted to join male service organizations. Since that time, the organization has worked to help women improve their standing in the world. Despite tremendous strides, women still do not enjoy equal economic or social status with their male counterparts. As an organization of and for women, Soroptimist feels uniquely qualified to tackle the challenges facing today's women and girls.

What programs does Soroptimist offer?

Soroptimist members belong to local clubs. Clubs participate in the Dream Programs of Soroptimist, "Live Your Dream: Education and Training Awards for Women" and "Dream It, Be It: Career Support for Girls" to help women and girls achieve social and economic empowerment. Programs The Dream of Soroptimist ensure women and girls have access to the education and training they need to reach their full potential and live their dreams. Soroptimist is committed to investing in programs that have a sustainable, measurable change for women and girls.

Soroptimist also sponsors LiveYourDream.org, an online community empowering volunteer action and activism. The self-motivated network is made up of people who wish to support women and girls in their quest to lead better lives, while gaining inspiration in their own lives. Members of the free online community work on topics such as women's economic empowerment, ending violence against women, human trafficking and more. They also have access to inspirational articles, tips and blogs that can help them live their own personal dreams.

How are Soroptimist programs funded?

Soroptimist programs are funded by investment income, member dues and contributions from clubs and members. As a 501(c)(3) charitable organization, Soroptimist also depends on outside contributions from people who support the Soroptimist mission.

What is the relationship between Soroptimist International of the Americas and Soroptimist International?

Soroptimist International of the Americas, headquartered in Philadelphia, PA, is one of federations four comprising Soroptimist International (SI), which is headquartered in Cambridge, England. The other three federations affiliated with SI are: Soroptimist International of Great Britain and Ireland, headquartered in Cheshire, England; Soroptimist International of Europe, headquartered in Geneva, Switzerland; and Soroptimist International of the South West Pacific, headquartered in Sydney, Australia.

How many members are in Soroptimist?

Soroptimist International has about 76,000 members. Soroptimist International of the Americas has about 30,000 members.


How many countries make up Soroptimist?

Soroptimist International members reside in over 120 countries and territories throughout the world. Soroptimist International of the Americas' clubs are located in 20 countries territories: and Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Guam, Colombia, Ecuador, Japan, Korea, Mexico, Northern Mariana Islands, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Philippines, Puerto Rico, Taiwan, United States and Venezuela.

What is Soroptimist's relationship with the United Nations?

Soroptimist International has consultative status with the United Nations' Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) which oversees U.N. activities and policies promoting human rights. Representatives from Soroptimist International can request agenda items, submit written statements for circulation to all members of the council, make oral statements at meetings and contribute gatherings other U.N. to Soroptimist seminars. and representatives are volunteers and work in one of the four U.N. centers in New York City, Paris, Vienna or Geneva. It is in this forum that Soroptimist representatives can advocate for Soroptimist mission the of improving the lives of women and girls.



JANUARY 19, 2017 HUMAN TRAFFICKING SYMPOSIUM



STOP HUMAN TRAFFICKING EVENT

On January 19, 2017, Soroptimist International of Corona and Soroptimist International of Riverside along with Grove Community Church held a Stop Human Trafficking event.

of the STOP The goal TRAFFICKING event was to raise in the awareness general population about trafficking and sex slavery. An awareness-raising project was selected because a necessary first step in ending the problem is making sure that everyone knows it exists. Once enough people are aware of the problem, they can work together to make sure it ends.

The evening began with welcomes by Shawn Dredla, SI Corona Event Chair; Pastor Joe Hobbs, The Grove Community Church; Michelle Volante, President, Soroptimist International of Corona; Janet Payton, President, Soroptimist International of Riverside; and Vicki Hightower, Riverside County Chief Deputy District Attorney.

After a short invocation by Pastor Hobbs the Documentary, "Teenage \$ex 4 \$ale: Human Trafficking in San Bernardino County," was shown to the audience. This movie was chosen as it shows the problem at a local level.

When the movie was completed we heard from 16 panelists. Each panelist told us what their organization does for victims of Human Trafficking and how they are helping young women to learn to see the signs and avoid getting involved. With 16 panelists the time allotted was very short. They each had just two minutes to tell the audience what their organization does and what the public could do to help.

INSPIRE LIFE SKILLS TRAINING "ADOPT-A-HOME" PROGRAM Inspire LIFE SKILLS TRAINING RESIDENT PROFILE Ashley entered the foster care

system when she was two years old. She lived in multiple group and foster homes in California, Florida, Montana and Washington. The "system" attempted to locate her near family members in the hopes that she could receive support and live with family. perhaps Unfortunately, the family homes available to Ashley were deemed unsafe, so she remained in foster care.

At 18, Ashley was notified by the system that she was on her own (this was prior to the fairly recently enacted government program which allows foster youth to receive financial support from the system until age 21). Ashely focused on education as a way to survive. She hoped that she could obtain scholarships to allow her to pay for room and board while she pursued her education. However, the reality was much different for her and she found herself homeless. She moved to Riverside to take advantage of a housing program in the city. However, the program wasn't a good fit for her because it focused solely on working and Ashely was determined to continue to pursue higher education.

Once in Riverside, Ashely worked as a peer mentor for a non-profit organization which contracts with the County to provide assistance to former foster youth. While at that organization, she attended a transitional housing workshop and was introduced to the Inspire Program which proved to be a perfect fit.

Ashely loves to learn and to help people. She continues to work as a peer mentor for the non-profit organization while she pursues higher education. In the Spring, Ashely will receive her Associates of Arts degree in Sociology from Riverside Community College and will transfer to either California Baptist University or the University of California at Riverside to complete a Bachelor's degree. She will remain in the Inspire program until she completes her Bachelor's degree and has the financial ability to live on her Once her undergrad own. education is completed, she hopes to work as a Behavioral Specialist or Social Worker with the County of Riverside.

Ashley credits the Inspire program with not only giving her a place to live, but for the total emotional support she received from the program. The Residential Assistants in each of the homes are "big sisters" to the residents. Ashley's RA provided emotional support and gave her great advice when she encountered obstacles. The mentors assigned to her, first Karen and now Sandy, have had a tremendous impact on Ashley's journey. They gave her sound personal and financial advice and encouraged her to pursue her dreams. Her mentors encouraged Ashley to study abroad and Ashley spent a semester in Ireland last year where she took the opportunity to travel to France and England.

By adopting the Inspire house where Ashley resides, SI Riverside has joined in the effort to support these deserving young women to reach their educational and personal goals. Together, we can make a difference and rejoice in the accomplishments of young women like Ashley.






