

Chartered March 23, 1974

The charter party for SI Montclair on March 23, 1974 was sponsored by SI Ontario. It was originally part of the Pacific Region. Montclair was seen as the entrance to San Bernardino County, so the theme was "The Gateway to Service." Meals on Wheels was adopted as the first project. There were 22 Charter Members. Charter President was Betty Jo May.

"Inland Valley" was added to the Club's name in September 1993 in an effort to expand our area of service in the community.

Today, 43 years after our chartering, SI M/IV has a roster of 23 Members, is still very active in the community, and we still support the Meals on Wheels program with our monthly "goody bags" project.
