JANUARY 11, 2018 NATIONAL DAY OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING AWARENESS



National Human Trafficking Awareness Day is observed every year on January 11th. This observance was started in 2011 by Presidential Proclamation of National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month.

In 2011, President of the USA Barack Obama issued a Presidential Proclamation, designating each January to be National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month. The anniversary of this proclamation became known as National Human Trafficking Awareness Day.

Slavery was officially abolished in the USA by the Thirteenth Amendment in December 1865, however, its forms still exist to date. And the present-day USA is the source, transit and destination country for modern slaves: children, women and men.

These people can be of foreign nationalities or the citizens of the USA but they are all subjected to injustices of human trafficking including sex trafficking, forced labor, involuntary servitude, forced marriage and debt bondage.

Many mass campaigns are organized to observe National Human Trafficking Awareness Day. This helps raise public awareness of modern slavery. Creation of a number of organizations supporting and preventing human trafficking helps protect some vulnerable members of our community. SOROPTIMIST INTERNATIONAL PRESIDENT'S APPEAL 2017-2019



The Mwihoko Women Group in Kenya and the SI President's Appeal

The first of five projects to be supported on five continents, the 2017-19 SI President's Appeal, "Women, Water and Leadership," is to fund the Mwihoko Women Group in Kenya, formed in 2005 with the aim of improving the economic and social livelihood of its membership of 22 women.

Kenya has a population of 46 million and those who live in rural areas are dependent on subsistence agriculture for their food and livelihood. Women 60% constitute of these subsistence farmers. The water supply to these areas is scarce women and the require education vocational and training to manage their farms effectively and to ensure continued food security. Focusing on the region of Mitimingi in Nakuru County, this Appeal project will enhance women's capacity in leadership, food security, utility, clean water energy and economic development.

The Mwihoko Women Group working beaan with the Soroptimist International Union of Kenya (SIUK) in 2010, supported by Women for Water Partnership (WFWP) on a water and sanitation project, to increase access to clean harvested rainwater and improved sanitation.

During this time, the women were able to purchase some land and build a training center with a classroom and a Ventilated Improved Pit (VIP) toilet, together with a crop demonstration plot. Currently growing maize, grains and beans on their communal farm, the Group has run several training programs and community activities at the center, additionally purchasing solar lanterns, reducing the costs of fuel lighting and lowering levels of pollution. As a result of the water and sanitation project, a second women's group was formed, known as Mwihoko B Women Group, consisting of 30 members who also produce food, mainly for household consumption.



"Increasing your income as a women small holder farmer is quite a challenge in the Kenya

region of Mitimingi in Nakuru Countv" says Soroptimist Marlène van Benthem who recently visited this Appeal project in Kenya. "The soil is so dry that the women can only rely on rainwater harvesting. This President's Appeal project is a fantastic cooperation of Kenyan Soroptimist experts, supporting women in all aspects of the value chain; from sowing seeds to selling the crops on the market. The women need financial support in setting up this agriculture cycle successfully and to share their knowledge with other women farming groups".



Women Farmers

On the ground, the project will be coordinated by Soroptimists Rose Mwangi and Asha Abdulrahman, from SIUK. A pilot project is already underway with 74 women farmers. These women each own at least one acre of agriculture land including a water tank available for rainwater harvesting. They have organized themselves in a cooperative with a chair and treasurer and have a bank account for savings to purchase the necessary inputs.

Activities:

- A water tank will be installed to improve the availability and access to clean water to the women and community.
- The current training center will be suitably updated, giving the community the opportunity to expand their current activities.
- The "demonstration plot" will be secured and the center

will be equipped with appropriate technologies and tools to ensure the women have what they need to offer relevant training programs.

- Suitable seeds and fertilizers will be provided to each of the women farmers involved in the project, sufficient for minimum one acre of land.
- The Mwihoko Women Group, supported by SI Union of Kenya and local stakeholders, will identify and recruit 22 additional women farmers to be trained. After a soil analysis all women will complete a 2-3-day on-site training on the model land and will then be able to prepare their own land and begin planting so that their agricultural cycle is not disturbed.
- Good quality training programs will be established and a training curriculum set up following initial interviews where a baseline on the women's existing knowledge will help to design the program and decide on the starting level for the participating women.
- The women will attend a comprehensive farm clinic course for six days at the Egerton University in Nakuru where they will learn more about business farming options and learn hands-on skills on a wider range of topics in relation to crops and livestock, insurance, production techniques, processing and marketing skills.

It is hoped a total of 2,000 persons will achieve increased food security through properly cultivated selected crop in 396 acres and 126 multi-story gardens. A minimum of 374 women farmers will improve their economic situation as a result of using best practices and appropriate technology. After Mwihoko, the project will be copied to other communities within Kenya under the supervision of the SI Union and Clubs in Kenya and hopefully in neighboring countries as well.

Marlène concludes: "What a challenge to join hands as Soroptimists and make this happen. Moving to commercial farming and selling goods at the market would increase food security and standard of living. However, these women cannot produce crops on a bigger scale without the knowledge, education. technology and training required to do so and it is here that the President's Appeal will make a difference".

The SI Union of Kenya (SIUK) has 12 clubs and 156 members and will be working on the project with four SI clubs: SI Nakuru Club, SI Milimani Club, SI Karen Blixen Club and SI Maseno Club on the first project for the 2017-2019 President's Appeal, 'Women, Water and Leadership'.

Stop Human Trafficking Start Acting



1 1 Facts About Human Trafficking

- 1. Globally, the average cost of a slave is \$90.
- Trafficking primarily involves 2. exploitation which comes in many forms, including: forcing victims into prostitution, subjecting victims to slavery or involuntary servitude and compelling victims to commit sex acts for the purpose of creating pornography.
- According to some estimates, approximately 80% of trafficking involves sexual exploitation and 19% involves labor exploitation.
- 4. There are approximately 20 to 30 million slaves in the world today.
- 5. According to the U.S. State Department, 600,000 to 800,000 people are trafficked across international borders every year, of which 80% are

female and half are children.

- The average age a teen enters the sex trade in the U.S. is 12 to 14-year-old. Many victims are runaway girls who were sexually abused as children.
- 7. California harbors 3 of the FBI's 13 highest child sex trafficking areas on the nation: Los Angeles, San Francisco and San Diego.
- The National Human Trafficking Hotline receives more calls from Texas than any other state in the US. 15% of those calls are from the Dallas-Fort Worth area.
- 9. Between 14,500 and 17,500 people are trafficked into the U.S. each year.
- Human trafficking is the third largest international crime industry (behind illegal drugs and arms trafficking). It reportedly generates a profit of \$32 billion every year. Of that number, \$15.5 billion is made in industrialized countries.
- 11. The International Labour Organization estimates that women and girls represent the largest share of forced labor victims with 11.4 million trafficked victims (55%) compared to 9.5 million (45%) men.

Soroptimist International of Riverside has united with Soroptimist clubs in Corona and San Bernardino and with Operation SafeHouse and other non-profits to host a human trafficking awareness event.

The event will take place on January 18, 2018, at 6:00 PM at the Mt. Rubidoux Seventh Day Adventist Church located at 5320 Victoria, Riverside.

The goal of the event is to educate the public to recognize

indicators of human trafficking and provide information on what we as a community can do to fight against this heinous crime.

Non-profits will be present to explain what services are available to victims of human trafficking and offer volunteer opportunities for those who want to help.

MENTORING FOR YOUNG WOMEN

Soroptimist International of Riverside (USA, California) and Soroptimist International of Erlangen (Germany, Bavaria) have developed an exchange program to give young women from both cities the opportunity to have new experiences by staying in the respective partner city. The goal is to help advance professional personal and development of young women.

In 2018, SI Riverside is providing a participant the opportunity to visit Erlangen to get to know the lives of professional women through job shadowing and personal get-togethers and conversations with members of Erlangen's Soroptimist club.

The applicant should be between 20 and 25 years old, demonstrate an interest in the German culture, live in Riverside or surrounding areas and identify themselves with the ideals of Soroptimist International.

The program offers a stay of two weeks in the respective partner city which is planned for June 2018. The data in the application must be truthful and accurate. The application form must be legible and filled out completely in order to be considered. A resume and letter of recommendation must also be attached.
