All of our members may attend any breakfast or Chamber mixer at the Chamber member prices. Last month's breakfast was held at the beautiful Eldorado Polo Grounds in the Cantina Restaurant. Just put on your name badge and join the fun. For breakfast on the second Tuesday of the month, you must pay in advance on the chamber website. \$20 covers coffee, juice and a buffet of eggs, bacon, sausage, breads, fruit and more. The mixers are \$5 to attend and no reservation is necessary. There are four polo fields at Eldorado which provides spectacular views of the mountains in the distance.
