

SI M/IV Vice-President Milissa attended the June 7 Soroptimist Summit. President Virginia, Director Leslie, and Member Andrea joined in for Friday & Saturday. We split up to attend several workshops, including: Discover & Explore Your Mentoring Skills; PowerPoint; Social Media; Critical Thinking & Respectful Conversations.

The Live Your Dream Banquet was, as usual, inspiring. Five finalists received a total of \$17,000 from SIA and \$15,000 from Golden West Region. Since 1972, cash grants have been awarded to 30,000 women through the LYD program. In GWR, last year \$94,000 was distributed to 71 women and this year LYD awards totaled \$102,750.

The Installation Dinner on Saturday evening, with everyone decked out in "Denim & Diamonds," was a special and fun celebration for incoming Governor Lori and her Board. The evening ended with everyone on their feet....moving to Abba's "Dancing Queen!"

- >- GWR had 100% participation in the LYD Program for the 20th year

- >- the 2018-19 budget was approved as presented
- >- GWR year end membership was 913--in 40 clubs. The adopted budget projected a small decrease to 900

CHAFFEY COLLEGE CLOTHES CLOSET


