- Description: Building each other up; encouraging each other to take on leadership positions
- Principles: Encouraging the heart; utilize member strengths
- Activity: Creating "Queen for a Day" with toilet paper rolls" Select one member to be the model for a queenly gown, crown and scepter using toilet paper

Love of Country

Description: Prevalence in the community; looking for diversity within our clubs

- Principles: Welcoming to all; ensuring Soroptimist is represented throughout the communities served
