

Why Do We Do What We Do?


Soroptimist improves the lives of women and girls through programs leading to social and economic empowerment.



How many young children under age 9 years live in low-income families in the United States?

There are more than 15 million children under age 9 years who live in low-income families in the United States.

Figure 1: Young children by family income, 2016



Percentages may not add up to 100 due to rounding.

Note: Above low income is defined as at or above 200% of the federal poverty threshold (FPT), poor is defined as below 100% of FPT, and near poor is between 100% and 199% of the FPT. The low-income category includes both the poor and the near poor.








Does the percentage of young children in lowincome families vary by race/ethnicity?

Figure 6: Percentage of young children in low-income and poor families by race/ethnicity, 2016



Figure 8: Percentage of young children in low-income and poor families by parent employment and education, 2016






