Greetings Dear Soroptimisist Members,

What a wonderful opportunity this region conference is to celebrate our many successes.

Since 2012, Soroptimist has been creating our future...a future where we envision increased collective impact.

Why? Because we want to solidify our identity as a leading women's organization economically empowering women and girls who face obstacles such as poverty, violence or teen pregnancy.

We want to transform our organization through cohesive club and region action to transform more women and girls' lives through our brand-unifying Dream Programs.

- Increased our funds raised by 31%
- Attracted about 100,000 supporters to LiveYourDream.org
- Slowed our overall membership decline from a 3% loss rate to a 1% loss rate.

A member since 1982, she has held several leadership positions, including international program director, international board director, region governor and club president and treasurer. Dawn Marie retired in 2014 after serving as the director of the South Coast Region project for the state of California. She holds a Master of Science degree from Cal State University, Fullerton, and a Bachelor's Degree in Social Ecology from the University of California. In addition to her Soroptimist activities, Lemonds also serves as a board member of the Global Center for Women and Justice, and Peppermint Ridge. She also volunteers with the Aldersgate United Method-

ist Church in Tustin, and the Crystal Cove Alliance.



Marcia Ziclinski Having lived in eleven different cities and attended nine different schools while growing up, I finally call Scottsdale, AZ my home. I spent the majority of my thirty-seven years of teaching in the Phoenix area. A lifelong learner, I hold a Bachelors Degree in Psychology, a Masters Degree in Special Education and Administrative Certification from Arizona State University as well as numerous courses beyond that. I was inducted as a Master Teacher by Governor Janet Napolitano in 2008. I spent the last four years of my teaching career as a full time mentor to novice teachers. Always wanting to give back to the community outside of the classroom, in the 90s

I became involved with Teen Lifeline, a suicide prevention hotline in the Phoenix area. I joined Soroptimist International of Phoenix in 2010, finally being able to do so when I retired from the field of education where one does not typically stop working at lunchtime. I cherish the friendships I have made since joining this wonderful organization.

Being a lifelong learner, I love to read and travel. Every big trip I take is my new favorite. I loved India and its people the best until I went on a Safari in Botswana, Zambia and Zimbabwe. Then, Southeast Asia became my favorite last May after visiting a school in Laos and the home of a South Vietnamese man who fought alongside the US troops during the Vietnam war. Two of the highlights of my travel were staying in the home of a Soroptimist in Wales and meeting numerous Soroptimist there and attending the Soroptimist International of Great Britain and Ireland (SIGBI) convention in Belfast, Ireland in 2012.

For several years, Jennifer provided intensive case management to victims of human trafficking, developed services for these specific victims, educated and trained service providers, and facilitated the first regional task force on human trafficking in the Inland Empire. Currently, Jennifer is the Executive Director at Big Brothers Big Sisters,

aiming to prevent and intervene through 1-to-1 relationships that can change the course of a child's future. Some of her accomplishments include being a 2012 Attorney General's Award of Citizen Appreciation, 2014 Soroptimist International Golden West Region Award winner, 2014 NAACP Community Service Freedom Award recipient, and 2014 HOPE Collaborative Advocate of the Year Award recipient.

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DELEGATES INSTRUCTIONS FOR VOTING FROM THE FLOOR - 2018

- 1. Delegates vote on the indexes by using the voting cards which are given out at registration.
- 2. Delegates who wish to speak will go to the floor microphone and wait to be recognized by the chair. Once the delegate has been recognized, the delegate will state their name, their club, and then proceed with their question or debate.

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- 3. To make it easier for the chair to present a balanced debate, the following signs will be used:
 - The <u>**ROUND GREEN</u>** sign will be raised if the delegate will speak in favor of a motion.</u>
 - The <u>**RED STOP SIGN</u>** will be raised if the delegate will speak to oppose the motion.</u>
 - The **TRIANGULAR YELLOW** sign is a warning sign that can be raised for a question or point of order.
 - The **BLUE SQUARE** sign is for non-delegates who wish to speak.
 - The WHITE RECTANCLE sign is for privileged motions; to amend, refer, limit debate, lay on the table, take from the table, postpone indefinitely, reconsider, or call the question.
- 4. If a delegate wishes to amend any index, the delegate must obtain the proper form from the GWR Secretary seated near the podium. Two copies of the amendment motion will be necessary.

STANDING RULES FOR MEMBERS AND DELEGATES

- The Official Program shall be the Order of Business upon adoption of the Conference Body. The Order of Business may be modified at the discretion of the governor.
- For admission to the assembly hall and to facilitate identification and seating in assigned areas, members **shall be required to wear the badge issued** by the registration committee upon registration.
- Immediately following the opening ceremonies of the first business session, the credentials committee shall report the number of clubs in the region, the number of clubs registered, the number of region officers and district directors registered, the number of past governors in the region registered, the number of delegates registered, and the number of Soroptimists and guests registered and in attendance. The credentials committee shall make supplementary reports after the opening exercises at the beginning of each day that business continues and at such other times as requested by the presiding officer.
- If a registered delegate must permanently leave the Conference for any reason, the credentials committee may certify the transfer of a registered alternate in the same club to the status of a registered delegate who shall serve in that capacity for the remainder of the Conference. At the time of transfer, the credentials committee shall substitute a delegate badge for the alternate's badge. Such certification will occur as needed except during voting.
- No delegate may speak in debate more than twice or longer than two minutes on the same question on the same day, without the permission of the Conference body granted by a two-thirds (2/3) vote, without debate. An official timekeeper shall monitor time.
- A non-delegate may speak only once to a question, for two minutes on the same day, providing there is no delegate who wishes to speak. An official timekeeper shall monitor time.
- Debate shall be limited to thirty (30) minutes on any one question.
- Only the voting members of a spring conference may make motions, with the exception that a region coordinator or committee member acting as coordinator, may move the adoption of any items covered by that committee's report.
- To obtain the floor, speakers must rise, go the floor microphone, address the Chair, and after being recognized, state clearly their name and club.
- Conference participants wishing to make a motion or amendment shall use the Golden West Region Motion Form and present it in writing, in duplicate, to the governor (one for the governor to read and the other for the secretary.)
- All reports and other materials shall be typed and immediately upon presentation to the Conference body, shall be submitted to the secretary for the permanent record.
- Individual announcements from conference members shall be in writing, signed and submitted to the secretary.

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
